

THE FOAPLY TIPS FOR MISSIONS





Photos 1000 USD In Rewards 3 Weeks Left





dark and light, but it doesn't end there. We should involve color, tones and texture contrasts into the definition. Black and White photography is known for its natural contrast effect in every picture, where 2 colors are the only dominators. What about color photography? Check the color wheel to see which colors are each other's opposite. Use it to understand the color combinations and keep in mind – fewer colors in the photo means more dramatic contrast. Don't stop on the contrast of colors though, feel free to show the contrast between various situations, places or people.

Natural light indoors. One of the problems shooting indoors is the limit of natural light. There are a few ways to solve it. Try to position your subject by a window – it will help to give up the idea to use artificial lighting in product photography. If there aren't any ways to do that, then try to play with your camera settings. You'll need to change and experiment with ISO, aperture and shutter speed.

1. Increase your ISO in low light but watch out for the chance of getting noise, or grain, in your photos.

2. Open your Aperture as it will increase your exposure without showing the noise. Although a large aperture narrows your depth of field. Do it only if blurry background won't ruin the photo.

3. Slower shutter speed. It will bring more light through the lenses and make the photo brighter. Use a tripod for any shutter speed below 1/60.
